Local veteran celebrates 90th birthday

World War II, 19 cruises and seven trips to Hawaii are just some of the life events that Albert Qualls has experienced in his 90 years of existence.

Qualls currently resides at Mount Vernon Nursing and Rehabilitation, and he turned 90-years-old on Sat., June 18. His family held a small gathering and surprised him with the gospel singing group, Trinity Three, as southern gospel is his favorite kind of music. When asked the reason why he enjoys southern gospel, Qualls said because he was in a male gospel quartet in 1943 for a number of years.

Qualls retired from Whirlpool in 1988 after being employed for 33 years. Before that, he served in the United States Air Force and

his retiring rank was Corporal.

"After World War II ended, some of the men from my base visited Hong Kong, Japan and the Philippines."

Because he is a veteran, his grandson signed him up for the first Indianapolis Honor Flight in October 2014. The honor flight is a non-profit organization created to honor America's veterans for their sacrifices by transporting the men and women heroes to Washington D.C. to visit memorials.

"My grandson was my escort. We saw the changing of the guard and shook hands with a Medal of Honor recipient. I enjoyed being with other veterans, and visiting the memorial of World War II and the monuments. Then the citizens of Evansville gath-

ered at the airport to welcome us home; that place was mobbed, it was full of people welcoming us home."

Qualls favorite color is blue, he likes to work crossword puzzles and he is an enormous football fan of the Denver Broncos and Evansville Reitz Panthers. He enjoyed working on his Honda motorcycles and enjoyed repairing cars and piddling around in his garage.

"I have so many good memories, but some of my favorites are the first man landing on the moon in 1969; my grandson, Seth, playing football at Franklin College; and the trips to Hawaii with my wife. My wife was a good cook, and I never drank or smoke," Qualls explained on his secret to living to age 90.

Qualls married his wife,

Dorothy, in November 1944. The two raised their three children, Patti, Larry and Ken, in Evansville. Qualls is originally from Arizona but his parents moved to the Tri-State area when he was a child.

Qualls and Dorothy were married for 71 years before Dorothy passed away.

"For our 70th wedding anniversary party I was in the hospital, but my grandson set up Skype and my family was able to come talk to me through a computer. That was really something. My favorite memories with Dorothy are our travels. We traveled to Hawaii seven times, as well as Spain, England and Germany. She hated being on an airplane."

Qualls has one sister, Sharon Odell, six grandkids and five great-grandkids.

Tourism Commission ready to establish CVB

The Posey County Tourism Commission is ready to take the next step in the tourism process by formally establishing a Convention and Visitor's Bureau (CVB) for Posey County.

President of the Tourism Commission, Jim Spann, spoke to the Posey County Council last week and requested their support to form a CVB as a legal non-for profit organization. The tourism commission took its first step in putting Posey County on the map as a tourism destination

by launching its website in May.

"We believe we will be able to create the convention and visitor's bureau during this year," Spann said.

The county council gave consent for their support and approved for their attorney, Beth McFadin Higgins, to act as the CVB's legal attorney. One of the first steps is the tourism commission committee forming a board of directors that will consist of seven members to operate the bureau.

Spann said the innkeeper's tax will support the

creation of the CVB, and he believes approximately \$110,000 will be collected in innkeeper's tax funds in 2017. Spann also said he is estimating by the end of 2017, a total amount of \$175,000 will have been collected since the tax was established in 2015.

"We want to utilize only 20 percent of the \$175,000, leaving 85 percent untouched, which leads to approximately \$145,000 to be approved for the creation of the convention and visitor's bureau," Spann said.

However, Spann sought approval from the council

to fund the final six months of 2016 in order to begin establishing the CVB, meaning approximately \$47,855 of the \$145,000 budget would be spent this year.

In order to spend that amount, the tourism commission will need to pay their \$21,600 bill from the creation of the website, as well as advertise appropriation amounts of the \$21,600 and \$47,855.

The budget discussion for the convention and visitor's bureau was tabled until the council's July 12 meeting in order for Spann to advertise the two amounts.
